


North Side Santa Fe Dr. Pedestrian Improvements


Santa Fe Drive is subject to heavy vehicular traffic, especially during the hours when the most pedestrians are present.





The asphalt pathway on the north side of Santa Fe Dr. is heavily cracked, eroded, and uneven, making it difficult for some pedestrians to use.

- The north side route is also obstructed by utility poles with as little as 2.5' clearance.

- This portion of Santa Fe is a popular route for students and residents traveling to the mini-malls on either side of I-5 at Santa Fe Dr.



- The asphalt pathway on the north side of Santa Fe Dr. is heavily traveled despite its extremely deteriorated condition.
- Due to the path condition and width, many pedestrians walk in the street.

- The existing pathway is not wheel-friendly for strollers or wheelchairs. Many pedestrians travel in the street.

- The City has received calls and written requests to provide improvements from the parents of three children who attend San Dieguito Academy and use wheelchairs.


No improvements exist on the south side of the street.

•“No Pedestrian” signs are installed on the south side due to the danger posed to pedestrians.


• Pedestrians traveling on the south side jaywalk to the north because the only ped access on the I-5 underpass is on the north side.





This project will install curb, gutter, and sidewalk on the north side in place of the existing deteriorated pathway. The sidewalk and ped ramps at each cross-street will be constructed to accessible design standards.



The northwest corner of the Mackinnon/ Santa Fe Dr. intersection will be upgraded with an accessible ped. ramp.

The north side project will include the relocation of utilities as necessary to provide an unobstructed, accessible, and safe sidewalk.

The neighborhood in the immediate vicinity of the proposed sidewalk is a vital part of the community. The north side sidewalk will increase neighborhood connectivity and provide safe ped. access to facilities such as churches, a tennis rec center, new public theater, adult education center, high school, and montessori.



The proposed north sidewalk will complete the link between the existing sidewalk along the school and the sidewalk west of I-5 the City recently constructed. It will link community facilities including the grocery just west of I-5 and the Hall Park (construction beginning 2011).
